Current Jag Dylan Auker commits to Division I power Virginia Commonwealth Auker's signing marks 3rd early scholarship for the 2010 SJCC Squad

November 10th, 2009 – San Jose City College Baseball is thrilled to announce that current Jaguar Dylan Auker has verbally accepted a scholarship to play baseball at Virginia Commonwealth University. Auker becomes the third SJCC pitcher to sign an early scholarship with a national power.

Auker commits to VCU after a freshman season where he served as an integral member of the record breaking 2009 pitching staff. The do-it-all reliever was one of the Jaguars most clutch performers as San Jose City Baseball made their historic post-season run. The little righty, with the lightning arm and devastating slider, was 2-0 with a 3.16 ERA and 1 save during the regular season. Auker was even better in the postseason, going 2-1 with a 2.92 ERA and striking out 10 batters in 12 innings of playoff work.

Virginia Commonwealth Baseball is a member of the Colonial Athletic Association. The Rams are a consistent baseball force on the East Coast and make regular appearances in the NCAA Regional Playoffs. The historical Virginia Commonwealth University is one of the nation's oldest universities and has an equally impressive athletics background. Notable VCU Baseball Alumni include Major League Baseball All Star Brandon Inge and former SJCC Jaguar Nate Anderson, who later went on to play in the Colorado Rockies minor league system.
