November 5th, 2009 – San Jose City College Baseball is excited to announce that sophomore pitcher Matt Burns has accepted a scholarship to play for Sonoma State University in the 2010/2011 season. The lefty is the second Jaguar to sign early with a national baseball power.

Burns' commits after a freshman season where he led the Jaguars to the best season in school history. The crafty lefty made 12 starts and ended the season with a 3.77 ERA with an Opponents Batting Average of .199. Burns also competed in the prestigious CCCBCA Sophomore Showcase in October.

Sonoma State Baseball has long been considered one of the premier college baseball programs in all of the nation. The Seawolves consistently rank as a Top 10 ranked Division II school, including a College World Series appearance in 2008.
